Session 5: Leaving no one behind: preventing crises from deepening intergenerational inequalities



Roberto Cardarelli

Roberto Cardarelli is the Assistant Director in the Middle East and Central Asia Department (MCD) of the IMF, and mission chief for Morocco. Before MCD, he worked in the Western Hemisphere Department of the IMF where he was chief of the North America division and Southern Cone II division, and mission chief for Canada, Chile, and Argentina. He also worked in the Asia and Pacific Department of the IMF, as chief of the Regional Studies Division, and in the World Economic Studies Division of the IMF's Research Department, as senior economist. Mr. Cardarelli is an Italian national, and holds a PhD in Economics from the University of Cambridge, U.K.



Attiya Waris

Attiya Warris is the current UN Independent Expert on Foreign Debt and other related international financial obligations of States on Human Rights and is the only Professor of Fiscal Law and Policy in Eastern Africa. She is a Commissioner on the Lancet-O'Neil Commission on racism and Structural Discrimination in Health and Chairs the Supervisory Board of the Capabuild Foundation. She holds a PhD in Law and is a specialist in Fiscal Law, Policy and Development. She is an advocate, company secretary and arbitrator of 20 years standing. She has published widely, most notably her book "Tax and Development" (2013) is the first publication globally that links the areas of tax and human rights and her more recent publication "Financing Africa" (2019) is the first publication globally to map out African fiscal systems.



Turki Abalala

Turki Abalala is the Assistant Deputy Minister for International Relations Policy and Consultation at the Ministry of Finance, Saudi Arabia. He holds a Ph.D. in Economics and has a distinguished career in economic advisory roles. Prior to his current position, he served as an Advisor to the Executive Director at the IMF, following his tenure as an economic advisor in the central government. He has also held prominent academic roles, including Assistant Professor and Head of the Economics Department at King Abdulaziz University.



Deon Pierre Filmer

Deon Filmer is Director of the Research Group at the World Bank. He was previously Co-Director of the World Development Report on education, Learning to Realize Education's Promise, and was Lead Economist in the Human Development department of the Africa Region. He works on issues of human capital and skills, service delivery, and the impact of policies and programs to improve human development outcomes. He has published widely in refereed journals and has also produced or contributed to a number of books and reports. He holds a PhD in Economics from Brown University.



Adeel Malik

Adeel Malik is a political economist whose research focuses on long-term development, political economy, and economic history, particularly in Muslim societies. His notable work includes an award-winning article on 'The Economics of the Arab Spring,' which has been translated into Arabic and several other languages and it was featured in The Economist. He also co-edited a volume on "Crony Capitalism in the Middle East: Business and Politics from Liberalization to the Arab Spring" published by Oxford University Press in 2019. His research interests include the political economy of the Middle East and the interplay between religion, land, and politics in Pakistan. He holds the Globe Fellowship at the Oxford Centre for Islamic Studies and is affiliated with multiple research centers at Oxford University. He contributes to various media outlets and his previous research affiliations include: the Department of Economics, Oxford University (200405-); Merton College (200203- and 200506-); Center for International Development, Harvard University (2001), and Mahbub ul Haq Human Development Centre, Islamabad (19971999-).



Ibrahim Elbadawi

Ibrahim Elbadawi has been the Managing Director of The Economic Research Forum since 2017. He previously held the position of Minister of Finance and Economic Planning for the Republic of Sudan. His contributions extend globally, having been appointed by the UN Secretary-General to the High-Level Advisory Board on Economic and Social Affairs in December 2020. Prior to his current roles, he held key positions including Director at the Economic Policy & Research Center, Dubai Economic Council, Lead Economist at the World Bank's Development Research Group, and Professor of economics at the University of Gezira in Sudan. He holds a PhD in economics and statistics from North Carolina State and Northwestern universities in the USA. He has published widely on macroeconomics, growth, democratic transitions and the economics of civil wars and post-conflict transitions and co-edited significant reports and books. His regional specialization covers Africa and the Middle East.
