Lamia Moubayed Bissat

Lamia Moubayed Bissat is a development specialist. Her experience spans senior positions in Government, international development, and the private sector. She was appointed by the United Nations Secretary General to serve on the UN Committee of Experts on Public Administration (CEPA), and was elected Vice Chair. She currently leads a center of excellence in governance and public financial management in Lebanon and is a non-resident senior international fellow at the Asfari Institute for Civil Society and Citizenship at the American University of Beirut. Fluent in four languages, she holds an M.Sc. degree from the American University of Beirut and Professional Certificates in Strategic Policy Planning and Management from the UK. She was awarded the prestigious French distinction of “Chevalier de la Légion d’Honneur” for her dedication to development cooperation.



Azza Fahmy

Azza Fahmy, an esteemed jewelry designer in the MEA region, began her career over 50 years ago, inspired by a German art book on medieval jewelry at the 1969 Egyptian Book Fair. She has taken the role of translating the region’s culture and international art and historic references to the world. She became an apprentice in Khan El Khalili, Egypt’s ancient jewelry quarter, and later received a British Council scholarship to study at the City of London Polytechnic. Her craft has captured the attention of cultural and fashion cognoscenti and collaborated with world renowned designers, and has ventured into architectural design with KarmSolar. In 2013, she founded the “Design Studio by Azza Fahmy”, a pioneering design education hub. With her daughters Fatma and Amina, she continues to gain international acclaim and serves as a cultural ambassador for Egypt.



Khaled Mahdi

Khaled Mahdi is the Secretary-General of the Supreme Council for Planning and Development (GSSCPD) of Kuwait and the Programme Director of the Country Plan Action Program of UNDP in Kuwait. He is a member of several high-level government boards and committees, such as the Public Authority for Industries, the Kuwait Institute for Scientific Research, the Public Housing Authority, the Economic and Fiscal Reform

Committee and the Kuwait Master Plan 2040, among others. Since he assumed his current post, Khaled established four development research centers at GSSCPD: the Kuwait Public Policy Center (KPPC), the National Knowledge Economy Center (NKEC), the National Development Research Center (NDRC) and the National Sustainable Development Observatory (NSDO). In his capacity as Secretary General, Khaled established Kuwait's National Standing Steering Committee for the Implementation of the UN Agenda 2030, in addition to signing several MoUs with local and international organizations to bolster GSSCPD's capacity and to strengthen GSSCPD's bilateral relations with strategic partners. Khaled is a B.Sc. graduate of the University of Toronto and holds a Ph.D. degree from Northwestern University in Chemical Engineering.



Moneef R. Zou'bi

Moneef Zou'bi is a veteran in global sustainable development, specializing in Science, Technology, and Innovation (STI) within Higher Education ecosystems for over 30 years. He obtained his undergraduate and postgraduate degrees in Civil Engineering Technology and Management from Brighton and Loughborough Universities, UK. Furthering his expertise, he conducted postgraduate research at the Department of Science and Technology Studies at the University of Malaya. Currently, he serves as the Science Advisor to the Interaction Council (IAC). Formerly, he directed the Islamic World Academy of Sciences (IAS) for over two decades and now holds adjunct professorships at UCSI University and the University of Malaya in Malaysia. Passionate about humanitarian causes, sustainable development, science advocacy and diplomacy, he has lectured in over 30 countries, published over 60 papers, and authored the landmark Arab States Chapter of the 2010 UNESCO Science Report. Additionally, he is affiliated with various international organizations and serves on multiple boards, demonstrating his commitment to advancing science diplomacy and sustainable development worldwide.
